Facts of Our Faith

Article 4 of the Apostles creed:
“JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUSIFIED DIED AND WAS BURIED”

OUR PARTICIPATION IN CHRIST’S SACRIFICE
 618 The cross is the unique sacrifice of Christ, the “one mediator between God and men.” But because in his incarnate divine person he has in some way united himself to every man, “the possibility of being made partners, in a way known to God, in the paschal mystery” is offered to all men. He calls his disciples to “take up their cross and follow him,” for “Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example so that we should follow in his steps.” In fact Jesus desires to associate with his redeeming sacrifice those who were to be its first beneficiaries. This is achieved supremely in the case of his mother, who was associated more intimately than any other person in the mystery of his redemptive suffering. Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven.

IN BRIEF

619 “Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures.”
 620 Our salvation flows from God’s initiative of love for us, because “he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins.” In Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself.
 621 Jesus freely offered himself for our salvation. Beforehand, during the last supper, he both symbolized this offering and made it really present: “This is my body which is given for you.”
 622 The redemption won by Christ consists in this, that he came “to give his life as a ransom for many” that is, “he loved his own to the end”, so that they might be “ransomed from futile ways inherited from their fathers.”
 623 By his loving obedience to the Father, “unto death, even death on the cross” Jesus fulfills the atoning mission of the suffering Servant, who will “make many righteous; and he shall bear their iniquities.”
