There they crucified Him. 5th Sorrowful Mystery – The Crucifixion and Death: The curtain in the sanctuary was torn in two. Jesus uttered a loud cry and said "Father, into Your hands I commend my spirit." After this, He expired.

PRO-LIFE MEDITATIONS – Sorrowful Mystery
